Introduction

Preventive Conservation is the mitigation of deterioration and damage to cultural property through the formulation and implementation of policies and procedures for the following: appropriate environmental conditions; handling and maintenance procedures for storage, exhibition, packing, transport, and use; integrated pest management; emergency preparedness and response; and reformatting/duplication. Preventive conservation is an ongoing process that continues throughout the life of cultural property, and does not end with interventive treatment.

The purpose of the workshop is to discuss and practice the risk management approach to conservation of collections. Risk management can be understood not only as the management of rare catastrophes, but also as the management of slow continual hazards, and everything between. It becomes an integrated view of all expected damages and losses to collections. The workshop reviewed the risk management concept and its various current interpretations and applications in the field of cultural heritage. The aim of this workshop was to touch upon some of the basic principles of preventive conservation especially of textile objects. This has been designed in interactive manner with the resource persons from the field of conservation and textile museum experts to make people aware of its importance. It includes small lectures, talks and demonstrations by conservators and resource persons from the Textiles & Clothing Research Centre (TCRC), New Delhi. Also the aim of the workshop to create awareness about the country's textile heritage and to brought in focus the fragility of these objects if not cared properly. The participants will learn basics of handling, examination, documentation and labelling, as well as proper storage and display of textiles. The main objective of workshop is to emphasize on the significance of preventive conservation for textile collections and to learn the intricacies of mounting and support making.

Participants will be introduced to a practical method to carry out a risk assessment survey for collections in museums. By the end of the course participants should be able to:

- 1- identify all agents of deterioration;
- 2- identify risk types;
- 3- estimate magnitudes of risks;
- 4- rank their relative importance;
- 5- Implement consistent environmental monitoring for temperature, relative humidity, and light levels in storage, exhibit, and work-processing areas.
- 6- Implement an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) program throughout the building in public, staff, and collection storage and exhibit areas etc...

Thus, participants will be able to put into application the proper preventive conservation measures to safeguard collections under their custody.

Participants

The workshop is designed for museum curators, museum technicians, conservators and Gallery attendants. This event is intended to serve as a basic introduction to preventive conservation techniques and measures which hopefully will provide the impetus to conduct more comprehensive workshops in the future.
